The ministry allows networking with women of faith for spiritual growth, social networking and vocational growth. Activities may be social, service projects, retreats for varying interests and skills. The group is made up of women from all aspects of the parish regardless of age (over 18), married, single, working or retired.

Safe & Sacred Protocol Training

Everyone who works with young people and/or vulnerable adults shares the responsibility of creating safe environments. We are all charged with treating life with the respect and dignity given to each of us by our God.

All staff, clergy and religious volunteers who work directly with children must complete the diocesan online Safe Environment Training Program every three years.

You will also be asked to complete a background screening application as part of the safe environment training process. Your training certificate will not be issued until the results of your background screening are reviewed. The program is designed to be respectful of the topic and your time.
